Neurodiversity Workshop for parents

Do you have a child who is neurodiverse or who is on the pathway? Has your child been diagnosed with ASD or ADHD? Or are they on the pathway for an assessment?

Have you ever wondered if your child may be neurodiverse? Do you want to learn about what being neurodiverse really means? Do you want to know how we support neurodiverse pupils in school?

We are delighted to be offering a workshop for parents on <u>WEDNESDAY 6TH NOVEMBER</u> from <u>9.15am-11.15am</u> at Waddington and West Bradford Primary School.

The workshop is based around: 'Neurodiversity: Deepening Understanding and Strategies for Behaviour Management'
